JOB TITLE: Field Technician II/III Lummi Natural Resources (LNR) Harvest Management (HM)

JOB SUMMARY: Under the direction and supervision of the Shellfish Biologist III and senior-level staff, the Field Technician II/III will provide technical and administrative support in monitoring and assessing shellfish populations within the Lummi Nation's usual and accustomed fishing grounds and stations (U&A). The Field Technician II/III will primarily be assisting with intertidal shellfish surveys and supporting subtidal shellfish survey work. The incumbent can expect to spend up to eight hours a day on their feet, full days on research/ commercial fishing vessels in variable weather and carry loads of up to 50 pounds. This role requires strong organizational skills, attention to detail, and self-motivation. This position is funded for 40 hours per week between March 1st, 2024 – October 30th, 2024. This position is not eligible for health and retirement benefits.

ESSENTIAL JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following, and other related duties as assigned.

A. Primary Field-Based Activities

- 1. Assist with planning and participate in intertidal clam biomass surveys to estimate harvestable biomass on Lummi Reservation tidelands
- 2. Participate in the assessment of juvenile Dungeness crab populations in waters and tidelands adjacent to the Lummi Reservation
- 3. Support population assessments of geoducks at stations within the Lummi Nation's U&A

B. Secondary Field- & Lab-Based Activities

- 1. Support sea cucumber spawning research, including documenting field measurements and laboratory dissections
- 2. Assist with eelgrass surveys on Lummi Reservation tidelands
- 3. As needed, participate in the assessment of larval Dungeness crab populations in waters and tidelands adjacent to the Lummi Reservation
- 4. Support additional population and life history assessment for other subtidal shellfish
- 5. Participate in field monitoring and assessments of adult populations of Dungeness crab, spot shrimp and, coonstripe shrimp, before, during, and after commercial fisheries
- 6. As needed, participate in weekly shellfish biotoxin sampling events

C. Administrative (other duties as assigned)

- 1. Clam biomass survey data entry into the custom-built Clam Survey Web App Database
- 2. Clean and maintain field gear used in intertidal and subtidal surveys
- 3. Assist Harvest Management Clerk with collecting fish tickets, gear registration, and data entry

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Field Technician II: Graduation from high school (or GED) AND two years of experience as a registered fish/shellfish harvester or work in an environmental agency or office. College level course work in environmental or natural sciences may substitute, year for year, for the required experience
- Field Technician III: A bachelor's degree involving environmental or natural sciences. Experience at or above a Technician I level may substitute, year for year, for education.
- Must possess a valid Washington State driver's license and meet eligibility requirements for tribal insurance.
- Lummi/Native American/Veteran preference policy applies.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS:

- Knowledge of marine invertebrate biology and ecology, preferably bivalve shellfish species and crustaceans of the Puget Sound
- Experience with field survey methodologies
- Familiarity with common lab etiquette and procedures, including invertebrate dissections <u>is</u> preferred
- Use of independent, sound judgement in completing assigned tasks and making informed decisions
- Ability to communicate effectively with department staff, the Lummi fishing community, and the general public.
- Ability to travel regionally and to work a flexible schedule primarily in the field, sometimes in inclement weather
- Must be physically fit and able to: stand and walk for long periods, up to six hours and work on a moving fishing vessel, sometimes in inclement weather and rough sea conditions
- Comfortability with common computer software applications (e.g., Microsoft Word, Excel, Access, and PowerPoint)
- Experience with georeferencing equipment (e.g., chart plotters and handheld GPS units) and associated software
- Familiarity and experience with deck and working conditions aboard commercial fishing vessels, and proficiency in towing, handling, and maintaining small power boats is preferred
- Must be a highly motivated self-starter who is willing to work independently or in a group while following specific activity instructions

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must pass pre-employment and random drug and alcohol test to be eligible for and maintain employment, as required by the LIBC Drug & Alcohol-Free Workplace Policy
- Position requires extensive Criminal Background Check
